## Parent School Survey July 2015

Thanks to everyone who took the time to fill in the questionnaire at the end of the summer term. We had a good response and on behalf of the governors at the school I've been looking at what you've been telling us.

The good news is that almost all parents think that the school is performing well.

The table below shows the excellent scores when we look at the percentage of parents who agreed or strongly agreed to each statement.

What's more, over the last three years we've seen a good improvement in the percentage of parents who *strongly agree* with each statement too.

Homework is the most contentious area - about one in eight parents thought the level of homework wasn't appropriate for the age of their child. Some parents thought there was too much, some wanted changes to when homework was set and handed in.

The Head and the teachers have once again looked at this. They think homework is a vital tool in improving skills, confidence and independent learning. Last year, the homework policy was amended and this year it's been reviewed and slightly amended again. The message from the school is to ask, if you have a particular problem with your child and the homework tasks set.

We also asked for any additional comments.

One parent higher up the school thought the house-point system was demotivating for their child. The school has looked at this and reviewed the way points are handed out. It's hoped all children should benefit from the revised system.

Another parent wanted more feedback. The School believes the parents evenings, access to children's work, topic book reviews, work sent home, communication letters and the very comprehensive end of year report should keep you in touch with your child's progress. But anyone who needs more information please talk to the child's teacher either informally at the beginning or end of the day or through a planned time.

There were many, many lovely comments too! Here's a sample:

Lots of meetings and opportunities to watch, observe and to take part with lessons. I really appreciated this opportunity.

The school is amazing with communicating and the reports we have had sent to us are full of such detail.

I could not be prouder of my son's first year at school. The development he has made has been outstanding. He loves coming to school every day.

Mrs Linford tackles problems promptly when she's made aware.
