<u>Topic Events - Spring 2024 - Years 3 and 4</u> <u>Amazing Americas</u>

As part of our topic, 'Amazing Americas', Years 3 and 4 will have a lot of exciting events happening.

Visit to Tilgate Nature Centre - Thursday 25th January



This is a new trip this year for our topic Amazing Americas. We will be visiting Tilgate Nature Centre on Thursday 25th January. This valuable educational visit will provide the children with a greater understanding of adaptation and will also approach the topic of deforestation. We will also have the opportunity to handle some animals. The children will be taking part in workshops, exploring the woods, and recording any animals, plants and living organisms we find. This will inform our future

learing of comparing the Amazonian forest to a forest near us (Tilgate Forest). The trip will really enhance the children's understanding of their topic.

We will need to set off at 9:00am sharp and would ask that all children are in school by **8:50am** at the latest please. We will arrive back towards the end of the school day. Children will need a packed lunch as we are off site so please amend your order on Parentpay to cancel any hot meals booked. Children are also encouraged to bring plenty to drink in a non-breakable container (no cans/glass bottles please), and a piece of fruit from home for a morning snack. We will be wearing school uniform for this trip, but please wear a suitable weatherproof coat and sturdy footwear as part of the day will be outside.

If your child needs medication for travelling please contact the office before the trip takes place so the necessary consent forms can be signed.

The children **do not need to bring any money** with them as we will <u>not be</u> visiting the gift shop on site.

Zoolab Visitors – Thursday 1st February



To further support the children's learning about rainforest habitats and deforestation, 'Zoolab' will be coming into school on Thursday 1st February. Zoolab's intrepid Ranger will take the children on an exciting journey through the Rainforest's important ecosystem. The children will learn about the layers of the Rainforest while getting



hands-on with some very special 'friends'. The children will be able to learn about the life in the steamy tropics and why they are coming under threat.
