Aims and Objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- identifies the children with the school;
- supports our commitment to inclusion;
- o prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class;
- o is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind;

Expectations

We expect all pupils to comply with this School Uniform Policy, which will be monitored. Any pupil who falls short of these requirements will be advised of this fact by their class teacher and given the opportunity to improve. Continued failure to comply will be brought to the attention of the Head Teacher.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair, and that the child's name is written on all items.

The Role of Governors

The Governing Body supports the Head Teacher in implementing the School Uniform Policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the School Uniform Policy and liaises with the Head Teacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the Governors' responsibility to ensure that school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the School Uniform Policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.
