Face Masks

Drop Off and Pick Up

Thank you to all the parents who have adapted to our new drop off and pick up systems and timings. We do appreciate all your support and efforts to maintain social distancing at these times. A gentle reminder that families should be at least a metre apart where possible and once you have dropped off / picked up your children, you should then leave the school premises.

Test and Trace

Communication

If you need to speak to your child's teacher please can I remind you not to do this at pick up at the gate to enable all of us to stay safe. Please call or email the School Office, and the teacher will get back to you as soon as they are able to. I know that this can be frustrating for all concerned as we are all used to being able to have a quick chat. Please can you also make sure that if there are any changes to who is picking up your child that this is communicated to the office as soon as possible, preferably before lunch-time. We really appreciate your support with this.



Parking Outside of School

We have unfortunately had a complaint from a resident that a car is regularly parking where the cones are outside the school. This does cause a safety concern for all of our children as it limits the eye lines and what children can see as they try to cross the road.

Healthy Schools

If your child would like a snack at morning break-time, we would be grateful if you could ensure that they bring in either fruit or vegetables. Please **do not** send your child to school with **sesame seeds**, **nuts**, **peanut butter or products containing nuts** for their morning snack or lunch as we do have children in the school who have severe allergies to such items. Grapes should be cut in half please. Snacks are provided by school for all children in Reception, Years 1 and Year 2, but they can bring in their own if they prefer.

We also ask children to bring in a **named, clear plastic** bottle for drinking water in class. These should not be used for drinking squash or fruit juice in class. Bottles are available from the school office for £1.00.

Is Your Child Entitled to Free School Meals?

What you need to know: Free school meals are only available in England and Wales. Your child might be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Please remember that even if your child doesn't want to have the free meal, they could still benefit in other ways through the Pupil Premium funding we would receive as a school. For more information, please speak to Christine Gilliam in the Office.



Extra-Curricular Clubs – Outdoors
