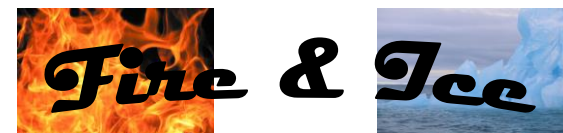
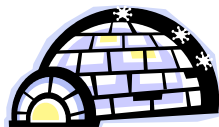

We hope you had a lovely Summer holiday and we are looking forward to teaching your child in Year 1 and 2. We will be working hard over the next few weeks to ensure that all the children are settled and happy in their new classes. We will begin our term with a focus on the children's emotional well-being and getting them used to being back at school with their peers. Our topic this term is 'Fire and Ice' which will be a very exciting topic for the children. Due to current circumstances we are unsure of whether we will be able to have visitors in school this term, although we do hope we may be able to have a visit from the Fire Brigade as well as a performance of the Great Fire of London by Rainbow Theatre as part of our history topic. We will inform you once we are made aware if and when these events are able to take place.

We are really excited that we have developed our outside environment, creating an 'outdoor classroom' for our key stage bubble to enjoy. The children will have the opportunity to access this daily, exploring different learning activities and working with others.

Please ensure your child brings their own pencil case and water bottle to school every day, and that these are clearly marked with the child's name and class.

Children will need their PE kits in school all week, these will need to be clearly named. This includes trainers/plimsolls as these will need to be worn during outside PE sessions. Please can you check that these fit correctly. If your child wears earring studs, please provide 'micropore' tape to cover them. Please remember that no other jewellery should be worn at school.

Reading

Once your child has settled back into school, they will bring home weekly homework. The homework will be in the book bags on Fridays and should be returned the following Wednesday. Homework can also be accessed through the VLE. It will contain a Maths activity (set weekly), practice of multiplication tables (2, 3, 4, 5 and 10), and a Topic activity (set bi-weekly) for you to do with your child which builds on their learning in school. Homework activities should take up to 15 minutes each. The homework letter will keep you informed of what is happening in the classroom and any special events that are taking place.

Your child will receive a Super Hero Zapper each week with their focus words for the week on them. Please help your child to learn these words at home.
